



GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR SPORTS TOURNAMENTS ORGANISED BY POLITECNICO DI MILANO

ART. 1_Sports Tournaments

These regulations lay down the procedures for the organisation, participation and management of sports tournaments organised by Politecnico di Milano for both male and female students and the University's teaching and technical-administrative staff.

The sports tournaments organised by the University are non-competitive and aim at enhancing the sense of belonging and stimulating team spirit.

The specific rules of play for organised competitions are the responsibility of the technical organiser, as per ART. 5.

These regulations do not apply to sports events organised by the University that involve the participation of athletes who are not students or staff of Politecnico di Milano.

Sports tournaments organised by Politecnico include, but are not limited to:

- Polimi League: a tournament held during the first academic semester, competing teams are composed of male and female students from the same study programme
- Spring Games: a tournament held during the second academic semester, for male and female students; students are free to build their own team also with students from other study programmes
- 6 campus: a tournament for male and female students with the participation of representatives from each Campus of Politecnico (Leonardo, Bovisa, Piacenza, Cremona, Lecco, Mantova).
- Polimi Off-work tournaments: tournaments for Politecnico's teaching and technical-administrative staff. PhD students can also participate.

ART. 2_Participation Requirements

Participation may require payment of a registration fee. Fees for the various activities can be found on www.sport.polimi.it. In addition to the registration fee, each participant must hold a basic membership and have a valid medical fitness certificate for non-competitive or competitive sport activity. The tournament fee **is not** refundable.

ART. 3_Organising Committee: Appointment, Composition and Tasks

The Organising Committee is in charge of supervising the entire organisation of tournaments and reserves the right to carry out all the checks it deems appropriate concerning both the registration of individual players and the requirements for participation. The Organising Committee is also responsible for deciding on any penalties imposed during the tournaments, communicating them at least 24 hours before the next competition.

The Organising Committee shall be appointed by a decree signed by the Head of Campus Life.

The Organising Committee consists of three members appointed by the Head of Campus Life, who is also responsible for their formal appointment. The decree of appointment shall indicate the name of the person who will act as chairman (chosen from among the 3 members) and that of the secretary taking the minutes, chosen from among the administrative staff working in the Campus Life area.



All participants must abide by the Code of Ethics and Conduct of Politecnico di Milano

All participants must abide by the Code of Ethics and Conduct of Politecnico di Milano.

The Code of Ethics and Conduct defines the ideals, values, principles and responsibilities shared and accepted by Politecnico community, which guide all University activities. The founding values of Politecnico di Milano are: responsibility, respect, integrity, professionalism, fairness, trust and transparency.

Any conduct that is not consistent with the Code of Ethics and Conduct shall be duly assessed by the Organising Committee; unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated and may result in exclusion from tournaments. In the event of exclusion, any request for registration fee refund shall be rejected.

For students only: should the Organising Committee detects a conduct that deviates from the founding values of the Code of Ethics, it shall inform the Head of Campus Life, who may then inform the Student Ombuds for possible activation of the Student Disciplinary Committee.

ART.5_Technical Organisation of Sports Tournaments

The SSD Polisportiva Politecnico di Milano is responsible of the technical organisation for the holding of the specific competitions in accordance with the instructions provided by the University about the formulas and rules of play, the sports disciplines involved, the calendar of matches and other specifications.

The SSD Polisportiva Politecnico di Milano shall publishes regulations for each specific competitions.

ART. 6_ Referee: Tasks and Attributions

A sports referee has the task of conducting and coordinating the match. They must ensure that the match is played according to the rules of the game; they also have the authority to signal any errors/fouls and misconduct by the players.

Their duties also include: identifying the players at the start of the match, confirming the result and preparing the match list.

ART.7_ Complaints

Complaints concerning penalties imposed during the activity may be submitted to the Organising Committee by e-mail at tornei@polimi.it.

ART.8_Duration and Entry into Force of the Regulations

These Regulations shall enter into force on the date of registration.

These Regulations shall remain in force until amended and/or supplemented.
